Special Meeting at HIRL at 7.30 pm Thursday 17 May: Guest speaker will be Steve Clark, "Birds and other wildlife of Uganda"

Steve Clark is an amateur ornithologist who lives in Hamilton and works as an agronomist at DEDJTR (the former Pastoral Research Institute). His talk will be a summary of a year that he and his wife spent recently in rural Uganda. While there the couple visited a variety of national parks and other wild places where Steve made good use of his photographic skills. Best known for his knowledge of birds, Steve also has other interests in the natural world and, apart from birds, his presentation will include gorillas and other mammals, bugs, scenery and aspects of rural life in Uganda.

Steve's wife Jenny was in Uganda as an educational advisor for the Australian School for Life Foundation. This is an organisation which is working to improve the educational standards of children in rural Uganda. It also provides training for local people in health and other occupations. Steve and Jenny were inspired by the enthusiasm and friendliness of the local staff and students.

The only thing they didn't like in Uganda was driving on the roads. Every day dreadful drivers seemed to be intent on running into them.

This event promises to be another exceptional presentation, in keeping with those that Steve has given in years past.
