Hamilton Field Naturalists has a number of activities listed for October.

- 1. Sunday 14<sup>th</sup> October First up and before our monthly meeting is the first of our annual weeding excursions at the Nigretta Flora Reserve. As many people who can help on this day would be much appreciated for any amount of time. We will meet at 9 am at the Hamilton Visitor Information Centre and travel in convoy to Nigretta. We will have to make an assessment closer to the actual date to determine whether we need to enter from the north through private property (with permission, of course) if the river is too high to cross, or we will park near the bend of the Wannon in the Nigretta Reserve and cross the river if it is low enough for us to cross.
  - a. BYO food and drinks for however long you can stay.
  - b. Wear clothing appropriate to the day sun hat, insect repellent, boots (snakes are already on the move in the district) and kitchen rubber gloves to protect hands from herbicide. (We use our specially adapted tongs to wipe the weeds individually HFNC supplies tongs, herbicide and bottles for carrying the herbicide.) For members who would like to help but prefer not to use herbicide you can help by bringing a very long screwdriver to dig out individual plants something to kneel on would be more comfortable than kneeling on the ground if this is how you would like to help.
  - c. This place is a delightful place to visit and to work as the orchids are usually on show and the views across the top of the falls are beautiful.
