
HAMILTON FIELD NATURALISTS CLUB

Background

The Hamilton Field Naturalists Club (HFNC) is a community group devoted to the study, enjoyment, conservation, protection and restoration of the natural environment.

The HFNC was formed in 1958 out of interest in natural history by members of the Hamilton community, and because of their concern for the conservation of unalienated Crown land in the district. They saw that unless action was taken, most of the remnant native vegetation, wetlands and associated fauna would be lost, due to preemptive action for farming, plantation forestry and other uses.

The founding members of HFNC set the agenda for the next 50 years of the Club's activities; to visit, study, record and promote the conservation of Aboriginal art and occupation sites, geological features and the native fauna and flora of the region. The objects of HFNC listed below in our constitution (ratified in Oct 2010) is a restatement of the aims of the founding members.

We strive today to live up to those objectives and philosphy that all species have a right to exist. We ask likeminded people to join with us in studying and enjoying the wonders of our natural world, and in helping to conserve it for future generations.

The objects of the HFNC

- To enjoy, appreciate and respect the features of the natural environment.
- To respect the Aboriginal history and presence in our region.
- To learn about the geology, fauna and flora of the region.
- To record the species of flora and fauna in our native forests, woodlands, grasslands and wetlands.
- To protect and promote the conservation of habitat, flora and fauna in natural landscapes.
- To gain long-term legislative protection of significant natural areas as National Parks, State Parks, Flora Reserves, Streamside Reserves or Wildlife Reserves.
- To understand the principles and practice of environmental management, including the use of fire, control of pathogens, and control of pest plants and animals.
- To restore degraded natural areas through appropriate revegetation, control of pest plants and animals, or restoration of water regimes in wetlands.
- To be advocates for the natural environment to educate and persuade by means of scientific publications, articles in local newspapers, conducted excursions to natural areas, serving on committees of management, participating on government committees and reviews, and by giving assistance to schools and other groups.

HFNC is a not-for-profit organisation and is a Member Group (No. A0011936S) of the Farm Tree & Landcare Association Inc., and is covered under the Associations Incorporation Act 1981.

HFNC has adopted the Model Rules for an Incorporated Association, with modifications as follows:

- (1) Membership of HFNC is open to a person who pays the annual fee there is no requirement to apply in writing.
- (2) HFNC business affairs are generally dealt with at Club Meetings (General Meetings, held 5 or 6 times each year).
- (3) The Committee of HFNC is the President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, plus Minutes Secretary, Publicity Officer and two ordinary members; Committee Meetings may be held from time-to-time to deal with club business.
