## **BIRDS TO SEE ON PORTLAND-PORT FAIRY PELAGIC TRIPS**

Sea birds (page No. from Pizzey, for illustrations):

- 1. Silver gull (p. 225) grey & white body & black wingtips
- 2. Pacific gull (p. 223) tip of low & upper bill red; black tail tip seen in flight
- 3. Kelp gull (p. 223) tip of lower bill red; legs ivory, white tail
- 4. Black-faced cormorant (p. 105) pied bird; black on bill & cap extends below eye and bill; black flank
- 5. Little pied cormorant (p. 105) small pied bird; yellow bill; adult has no black flank mark or yellow near eye
- 6. Great cormorant (p. 103) large <u>black body</u>; <u>yellow/white throat-face patch</u>
- 7. **Pied cormorant** (p. 105) large black & white body, <u>black flank patch</u>; <u>orange facial patch</u>
- 8. **Cattle egret** (p. 113) <u>yellow bill</u>, shorter tail & legs than intermediate egret.
- 9. White-faced heron (p. 111) grey body and white face marks
- 10. Sooty oystercatcher (p. 199) all <u>black with red eye</u>, bill & legs
- 11. **Pied oystercatcher** (p. 199) <u>black & white body</u> with red eyes & legs
- 12. **Caspian tern** (p. 231) v red bill & black cap & crest
- 13. Crested tern (p. 231) fairly large tern, yellow bill & crested black cap
- 14. White-fronted tern (p. 233) small bird, white saddle over bill & white collar below black cap
- 15. Little penguin (p. 46) blue-black above, white below
- 16. Australian gannet (p. 97) large; black tips & back edge of upper & lower wing; <u>orange crown & neck</u>
- 17. Arctic jaeger (p. 221) v brown falcon-like bird; whitish wing patches above & below; barred abdomen.
- 18. **Pomarine jaeger** (p. 221) as above, but bigger & <u>larger white wingpatch</u> at base of primaries
- 19. Long-tailed jaeger (p. 221) ~ as above, slender tern-like bird with long tail spines
- 20. Great skua (p. 219) v hooked bill, broad winged, bulky, dark brown bird with white base to primaries
- 21. South polar skua (p. 219) as above but smaller, pale nape and breast, fawn or grey collar
- 22. Great-winged petrel (p. 55) <u>large</u>, <u>long-winged brown bird</u>; whitish area around black bill; wedge tail
- 23. Kerguelen petrel (p. 55) greyer; paler inner leading edge; silver sheen to underside of primaries
- 24. White-chinned petrel (p. 67) <u>large, dark bird</u> with pale bill and sometimes a <u>whitish chin</u>
- 25. Southern giant-petrel (p. 51) juv. like big dark brown albatross, with massive yellow bill & nostril tube
- 26. Northern giant-petrel (p. 51) juv. as above but <u>orange tip on lower bill</u>; adult whitish face & neck
- 27. **Cape petrel** (p. 53) <u>upper body & wings chequered black & white</u>; underbody white; <u>black throat & mantle</u>
- 28. Southern fulmar (p. 53) grey & white above, white under, blackish tip to bill & wings

- 29. White-headed petrel (p. 57) black bill & eye; white head, front & rump; grey back & wings; white underbody
- 30. Grey petrel (p. 69) greyish upper body & wings (both sides); <u>all-white underbody except tail</u>
- 31. Soft-plumaged petrel (p. 59) dark grey underwing band, grey breast band on white underparts
- 32. Mottled petrel (p. 61) <u>heavy black M underwing</u>, grey abdomen; grey back with <u>black M</u>; <u>white throat</u>
- 33. Gould's petrel (p. 63) like Mottled petrel but <u>all white under</u> & <u>darker head & back of neck</u>
- 34. **Cooks petrel** (p. 61) white underbody; black back, grey wing & short underwing bar, <u>white forehead</u>; legs blue
- 35. Blue petrel (p. 63) blue-grey above, black M & white tail-tip; white underwing & body; black cap & neck patch
- 36. Antarctic petrel (p. 53) brown above; white underbody & tail, white trailing edge of wing
- 37. Wilson's storm-petrel (p. 91) dark bird with short & wide tail; white V over tail; 'bounces' on water
- 38. White-faced storm-petrel (p. 93) dark-backed bird dancing on water, white face, belly & wingstripe
- 39. Grey-backed storm-petrel (p. 93) as above, but <u>dark head & neck</u> with white belly & wing stripe
- 40. Black-bellied storm-petrel (p. 93) as above, but white band runs from side over rump; a dark belly midline
- 41. **Common diving-petrel** (p. 77) <u>small, fat, dark, diving bird;</u> short tail; white underwing, black edges
- 42. Fairy prion (p. 65) little bluish & white bird, skims waves; dark M on back, with wide black tail-tip
- 43. Slender-billed prion (p. 65) ~as above but shorter dark tail tip and only faint dark M on back; white eyebrow
- 44. Antarctic prion (p. 65) winter-spring visitor offshore but distinguishable from other spp. in hand
- 45. Salvin's prion (p. 65) similar to above
- 46. Short-tailed shearwater (p. 73) dark body; short wedge-tail.
- 47. Sooty shearwater (p. 73) dark body; large, whitish underwing patch
- 48. Flesh-footed shearwater (p. 73) dark; pale bill with black-tip; legs pink; pale base to u-wing primaries; fantail
- 49. Fluttering shearwater (p. 75) dark above, mostly white underwing & body; fluttering wing beats
- 50. Hutton's shearwater (p. 75) as above but more grey on neck and inner underwing.
- 51. Little shearwater (p. 77) small, fast-flying; blackish back, white under, narrow black trailing wing edge
- 52. Black-browed albatross (p. 83) <u>black eye-brow</u>, black wing above & tail tip & <u>wide black underwing edges</u>.
- 53. Yellow-nosed albatross (p. 83) yellow topline on dark bill; underwing narrow black edges
- 54. Buller's albatross (p. 87) gold top & base on bill; white crown, grey neck; ~ no black trailing edge on wing
- 55. **Grey-headed albatross** (p. 87) gold bill as above, <u>less white area underwing</u> & <u>all-grey head-neck</u>
- 56. Shy albatross (p. 85) bill grey-ivory, head-neck grey; narrow black edges underwing & black arm pit
- 57. Wandering albatross (p. 79) v. big; imm. brown & white mask; adult white body & b&w wings (old >white)
- 58. Royal albatross (p. 81) imm not brown; less white on upper wing than W Alb; black in tail & lead wing edge
- 59. Sooty albatross (p. 89) v. large, long-winged, sooty brown all over; pointed, wedge tail.
