## Notes

This reserve was gazetted in April 2005. Of the 57 ha, an estimated 30 ha is subject to inundation after low banks partially obstructed the stream/drain to create 7 seasonal pools. John Harris (Parks Victoria) planted 2,500 trees on the higher ground in 2005-07.

The swamp has access from an unused road off the West Boundary-Tabor Siding Rd.
